The Winthrop Lakes Region: Our Four-Seasons Vacation Area

Hundreds of acres of open land and more than ten lakes and ponds grace the Winthrop Lakes Region. The tidal Kennebec River is also close by. These natural features make the region perfect for year-round outdoor recreation, such as boating, fishing, cross-country skiing, and snowmobiling.

Lake Cobbosseecontee, with all of its islands, is truly the crowning gem of the region. Surrounded by the towns of Manchester, Monmouth, and Winthrop, it covers a 5,543-acre area and is about nine miles long. The name "Cobbosseecontee" comes from the Abenaki Indians, and means "the place of many sturgeon."

The Winthrop Lakes Region offers some of the finest smallmouth and largemouth bass fishing in Maine. Cobbosseecontee, in particular, is considered one of the best lakes in the northeast—many of the state's largest bass have sprung from it.

Bass tournaments take place on many weekends on several of the lakes. Besides the lakes, all of the major rivers and many of the smaller ones have bass fisheries. Brook, brown, and lake trout, perch, and pickerel abound in the region.

The other large lakes in the area are Androscoggin (3,826 acres), Annabessacook (1,420 acres), and Maranacook (1,673 acres). Leeds, Mt. Vernon, Monmouth, Readfield, and Winthrop offer public beaches.

About an hour from the ocean, the mountains, and Portland, Maine's largest city, the region is centrally located, with convenient access to I-95. Nearby cities and towns such as Gardiner, Hallowell, and Augusta also feature their own charm and interest, including cultural attractions, dining, and entertainment. Enjoy the many fun and interesting things to see and do here, which are often only minutes away.

About Our Towns & Lakes

FAYETTE

Settled as Starling Plantation in 1781, Fayette became incorporated as a town in 1795. It was named for Marquis de Lafayette, the French nobleman who offered his services to the Americans during the Revolution. Known and loved for its rural nature, seasonal resorts, and private camps, the town's 31.5 square miles of lakes and ponds draw anglers from all over. Plenty of woods and trails offer beautiful places to hike, snowmobile, snowshoe, and cross-country ski. A town of 1,200, Fayette borders the communities of Mount Vernon, Readfield, and Wayne. Several area farms sell a variety of goods and offer visitors the chance to pick blueberries and strawberries.

LEEDS

Leeds borders the scenic Androscoggin River, ideal for canoeing, kayaking, and other activities, and Androscoggin Lake, a popular sport fishery. The town was settled in 1779 as the Plantation of Littleboro and incorporated as Leeds in 1801. It was named after Leeds, England, the birthplace of the father of the town's first settlers. Early in its settlement, its pine trees and rich soils became resources for farming and trades, contributing to the town's growth. Grist mills were common then in Leeds, where all the grains in Maine were grown.

Among the local historic sites is Monument Hill, where Civil War generals Oliver Otis Howard and Charles Henry Howard placed the "Monument to Peace" in 1895. The obelisk honors this location where, as children, they played with their brother, Reverend Roland Bailey Howard, Secretary of the American Peace Society. The Rev. wanted to erect a monument there to commemorate the peace after the end of the Civil War. He died in 1892 before he could achieve that goal.

The town is also home to Camp Tekakwitha, the only entirely Frenchspeaking summer camp in the U.S., which spans more than 11 million square feet of timberland along Androscoggin Lake.

With a population of nearly 2,400, Leeds is a "bedroom" community for commuters in the Augusta and Lewiston-Auburn areas who enjoy a rural lifestyle. Agriculture remains among the industries that use the natural resources of Leeds, with its many open fields and large wooded areas. Leeds has sought to repurpose its old farm buildings to support the economy and use its land for trails and other recreational opportunities.

MANCHESTER

Settled in 1775, about 2,600 people live within the roughly 24-square-mile town, named after Manchester, Massachusetts, home to some of its early residents. The Manchester Community Church was organized in 1833 and still serves the community. Manchester has ample frontage on Lake Cobbossecontee and numerous ponds, including Bog, Jamies, and Shed. The town sits west of the state capital, Augusta, and all the amenities a larger city brings.

MONMOUTH

Incorporated in 1789 and named for the Revolutionary War battle in Monmouth, New Jersey, this quintessential Maine town features artistic culture and agriculture. It's best known for its historic Cumston Hall, an extraordinary building that dominates Main Street and dazzles longtime residents and visitors alike. A friendly walking village, Monmouth offers access to eateries, the public beach, the library, and the professional Shakespearean theater. The well-known Theater at Monmouth holds many performances from June through September.

The town's slogan, "Monmouth Grows," suits the abundant agriculture in the area, with a dairy farm on Main Street and fiber, vegetable, and poultry farms nearby. Historic Main Street buildings are part of the Monmouth Museum and are open to the public in the summer. Monmouth cultivates a diverse mix of artists, light manufacturing, health services, and in-home businesses along with an excellent school system. Roughly 4,100 residents populate about 34 square miles. Running, biking, boating, hunting,

longtime Boston English High School Headmaster Dr. Charles Cumston, who retired to Monmouth and donated the funds for construction. To design the building, he commissioned renowned regional painter Harry Cochrane, who was also an accomplished composer, musician, and writer—a true Renaissance man. Cochrane's design is a mix of Romanesque and other architectural styles. The building is decorated throughout with plaster ornamentation, beautifully crafted wood trim, hand-stenciled ceilings, and stained glass windows. The 250-seat opera hall features a fresco mural ceiling.

MOUNT VERNON

Mount Vernon features five square miles of water for swimming, sailing, fishing, and ice skating. Its 38 square miles of land provide many opportunities for hunting, cross-country skiing, and snowmobiling. Its population of 1,600 doubles during the summer when lakeside camps and cottages, which comprise nearly onethird of the housing, open for seasonal visitors. The town was incorporated in 1792 from Washington Plantation and is thought to have been named after President Washington's Virginia estate. The commercial district of Mount Vernon Village includes fire stations, a post office, and the Community Center located alongside a country store and specialty shops. The town's beautiful landscape and rural charm offer enjoyment for everyone.

READFIELD

Readfield was settled by 1760 and incorporated in 1791 and is thought to have been named after Kennebec Purchase land grant holder Major John Reed (or Read). This popular recreation spot features nine lakes and ponds, including Maranacook Lake and Torsey Pond for fishing and trailered boating. On the Lake sits The Readfield Town Beach off Route 17. Miles of trails for walking, hiking, cross-country skiing, and snowmobiling abound through acres of woods. In the second week of August, the Town Beach hosts Readfield Heritage Days, which offers music, fireworks, a barbecue, and other entertainment. Readfield is home to the college-preparatory Kents Hill School and Maranacook Community Schools, and its village centers, Kents Hill, Readfield Corner, and "The Depot" house several businesses. Dairy, apple, and other niche farms keep local agriculture alive. With a population of around 2,600, the town retains its rural character while it looks toward economic growth in small businesses and environmentally-friendly manufacturing.

WAYNE

Incorporated in 1798, Wayne was named for Revolutionary War hero General "Mad" Anthony Wayne, who captured Stony Point on the Hudson River from the British. Among its seven lakes and ponds, along Androscoggin Lake lies The Androscoggin Yacht Club, with a beach, docks, a club rowboat, clubhouse, and swimming and sailing lessons. Wayne's classic New England Village features a public library, shops, a general store, and a recreation center. Wayne's year-round population is roughly 1,080. It doubles in the summer when visitors flock to this recreation spot 15 miles west of Augusta for swimming and sailing, strawberries and blueberries, fresh vegetables, and its relaxed, small-town atmosphere.

Located between Lewiston, Augusta, and Farmington, nestled between many lakes and ponds, and a short drive from Winthrop.



WINTHROP

Incorporated in 1771, and named for the Colonial Governor of Massachusetts, the thriving Winthrop community's active downtown includes eateries, shops, tennis courts, a skate park, a beach, and Norcross Point waterfront park. Mt. Pisgah Trail, several large lakes and smaller ponds, and quiet country roads cross the roughly 31-square-mile area. They provide residents and visitors plenty of opportunities year-round to embrace the town's slogan, "We Play Outside."

Winthrop also hosts a sidewalk art festival, a holiday parade, live music, theater, and dance at the Performing Arts Center and programs at the Bailey





Public Library. With over 6,000 residents, Winthrop's diverse economy includes retailers, business and health services, light/high-tech manufacturing, outdoor recreation, tourism, and agriculture.



The region's lakes, ponds, and rivers offer a variety of opportunities for boating and fishing. Access to these waters is available at many locations. This list is by no means complete; for more detailed information about access, boating laws, and registration, fishing guidelines and licenses, call the Bureau of Parks and Lands, (207) 287-3821, the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, (207) 287-8000, or visit maine.gov. Besides the lakes and ponds with access (below), public landings line the Kennebec River in Augusta, Gardiner, and Hallowell. The New England Forestry Foundation's 800-acre Allen-Whitney Forest is Manchester's largest conserved space. Located on Scribern Hill Road, the property has about ten miles of non-



motorized trails suitable for mountain biking, hiking, walking, and other activities. The mixed-forest property includes Allen Hill, the highest point in Manchester, as well as access to Shedd Pond, Kennebec County's largest undeveloped pond. Monument Hill Trails

Two moderately steep trails split just after the trailhead to form a mile-long loop to the top of Monument Hill, with views of Androscoggin Lake and the area nearby. The hill was named after a Civil War peace monument built in the late 1800s by Leeds natives and Civil War generals Oliver Otis Howard and Charles Henry Howard.

Fort Western, America's oldest surviving wooden fort, was built in 1754 to protect settlers from the French and the Native Americans. Benedict Arnold used the fort as a staging point for his Revolutionary War assault on Quebec in 1775. The museum complex features the fort, store (former storehouse), and house (former barracks). The Readfield Union Meeting

House (RUMH) is known for its beautiful trompe l'oeil murals by Prussian painter Charles Schumacher. (French for "deceives the eye," "tromp l'oeil" paintings create the illusion of a real object or scene.) Hand-stenciled glass windows and a working 1890s pump organ are among the building's other noteworthy features. Maine's second oldest brick church, in 1982, the RUMH was placed on the National Register of Historic Places. The building is open for concerts, talks, and visitors.




